## MONUMENT

(H. B. No. 360, by Mr. Mortenson (by request) and Senator Steele)

## AN ACT

IN RELATION TO COLORADO SOLDIERS IN THE CIVIL WAR.

*Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

Section 1. That the Governor shall appoint a commission of four members, one from the 1st Colorado Cavalry Volunteers, one from the 2nd Colorado Cavalry Volunteers, one from the 3rd Colorado Cavalry Volunteers and one representing McLain's Colorado battery in the Civil War, who shall serve without pay except actual traveling and necessary expenses, to collect the data therefor and to cause to be made and placed on the Monument to Colorado Soldiers at the west front of the Capitol Building in Denver, Colorado, tablets containing a correct list of the battles of the Civil War in which Colorado soldiers participated, a correct list of names of all Colorado Soldiers who died or were killed in battle in the Civil War and such other historical data as to such Commission shall seem proper. The Governor shall be ex-officio a member of said commission.

Section 2. To carry out the purposes of this act there is hereby appropriated the sum of Three Thous-

and Dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary. The Auditor of State is hereby authorized to draw, and the State Treasurer to pay, warrants for the payments of voucher drawn by the Governor on his approbation.
