

CHAPTER 70

CONGRESSIONAL REAPPORTIONMENT

(S. R. No. 143, by Senator Peterson, and Messrs. Vroman and Miller)

AN ACT

TO DIVIDE THE STATE OF COLORADO INTO FOUR CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Four districts

Section 1. For the election of Representatives to Congress, the State of Colorado is hereby divided into four Congressional Districts as follows:

First district

The City and County of Denver shall constitute the First District.

Second district

The Counties of Adams, Arapahoe, Boulder, Cheyenne, Clear Creek, Douglas, Elbert, Gilpin, Jefferson, Kit Carson, Larimer, Lincoln, Logan, Morgan, Phillips, Sedgwick, Washington, Weld and Yuma shall constitute the Second Congressional District.

Third district

The Counties of Alamosa, Baca, Bent, Conejos, Costilla, Crowley, Custer, El Paso, Fremont, Huerfano, Kiowa, Las Animas, Mineral, Otero, Prowers, Pueblo, Rio Grande, Saguache and Teller shall constitute the Third Congressional District.

Fourth district

The Counties of Archuleta, Chaffee, Delta, Dolores, Eagle, Garfield, Grand, Gunnison, Hinsdale, Jackson, Lake, La Plata, Mesa, Moffat, Montezuma,

Montrose, Ouray, Park, Pitkin, Rio Blanco, Routt, San Juan, San Miguel and Summit shall constitute the Fourth Congressional District.

Section 2. All acts and parts of acts in conflict ^{Repeal} herewith are hereby repealed.
