CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

ALIENS—PROPERTY RIGHTS

(S. B. No. 142, by Senator Bashor and Messrs. Vroman and Miller)

AN ACT

TO SUBMIT TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE STATE OF COLORADO AN AMENDMENT TO SECTION 27 OF ARTICLE II, OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF COLORADO, CONCERNING PROPERTY RIGHTS OF ALIENS.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Constitutional

Section 1. There shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the State of Colorado at the next General Election for members of the General Assembly, for their approval or rejection, the following amendment to the Constitution of the State of Colorado, which, when ratified by a majority of those voting thereon, shall be valid as a part of the Constitution:

Article amended

Section 2. Section 27 of Article 2 of the Constitution of the State of Colorado shall be amended so as to read as follows:

Property rights
of aliens

Section 27. The General Assembly shall provide by law the right and power of aliens who are or shall be, under Acts of Congress or Treaties, ineligible to American citizenship; to acquire, inherit, possess, enjoy and dispose of property, real and personal.

Section 3. Each elector voting at said election and desirous of voting for or against said amendment, shall place in the ballot box his or her ticket whereon shall be printed the words "For the Amendment to Section 27 of Article 2, concerning property rights of aliens," and "Against the Amendment to Section 27 of Article 2, concerning property rights of aliens" and shall indicate his or her choice by placing a cross opposite one or the other of said group of words. Method of voting

Section 4. The votes cast for the adoption or rejection of said amendment shall be canvassed and the result determined by the laws of the State for the canvass of votes for Representatives in Congress. Vote canvassed
